Each evening brings a family of wild dolphins to the beach (adjacent to the Jetty), where they are hand fed by our Dolphin Care team and resort guests (included in most room types & on certain day cruise packages).

The iconic Tangalooma Wrecks comprises 15 boats which were sunk just off the shores of Moreton Island between 1963 and 1984 to create a safe harbour for boats. Now home to a myriad of different species of reef fish, coral formations and marine life, the wrecks offer incredible snorkelling and scuba diving opportunities, making the Tangalooma Wrecks an international must-see attraction. Tangalooma Island Resort offers guests several different tour options to visit the wrecks either from above or below the water to suit all comfort levels.
